

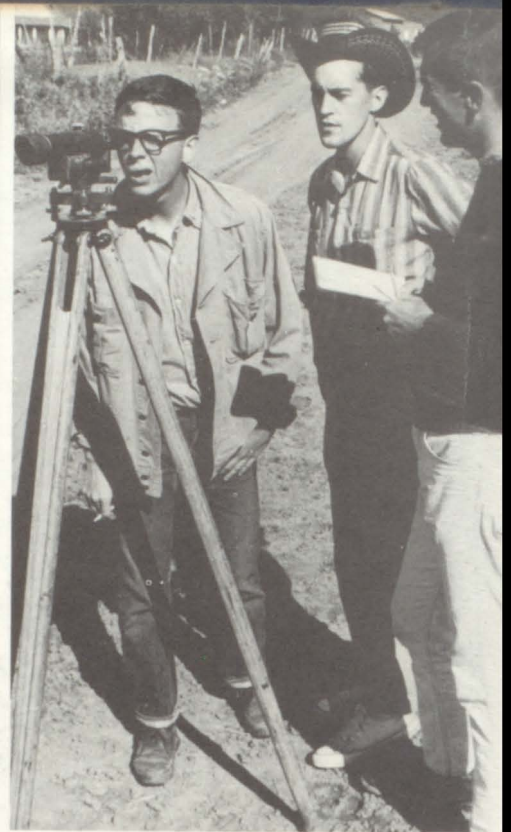

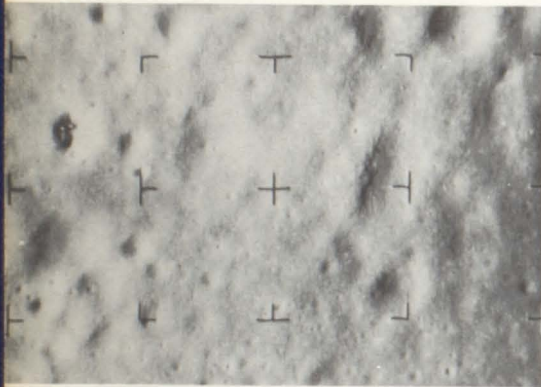

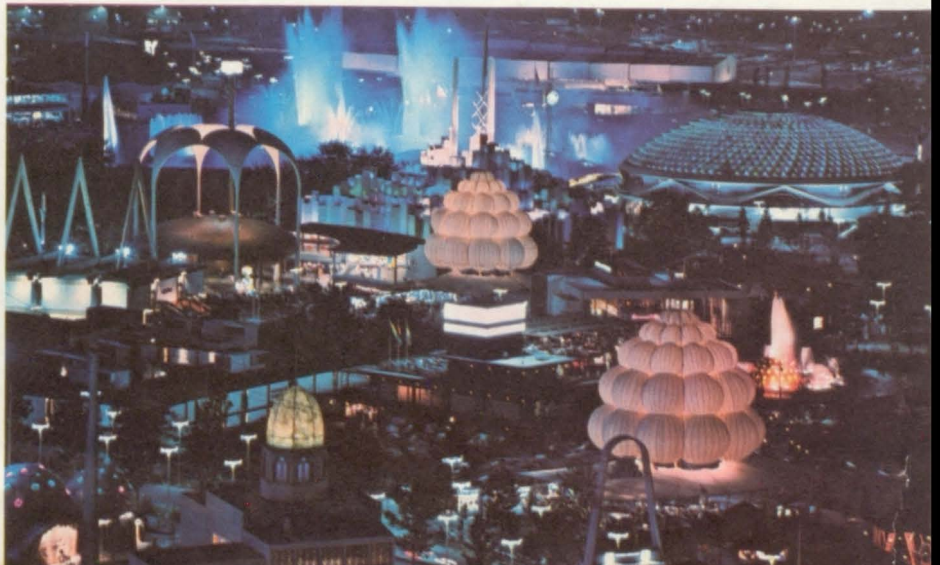

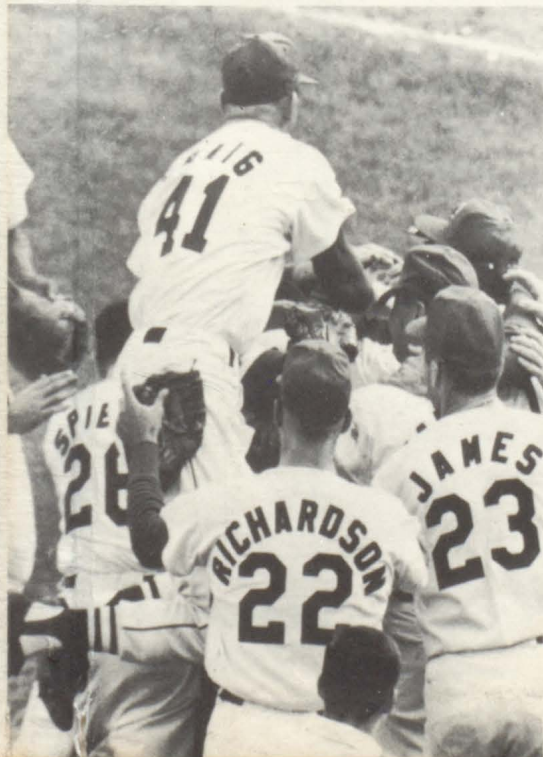

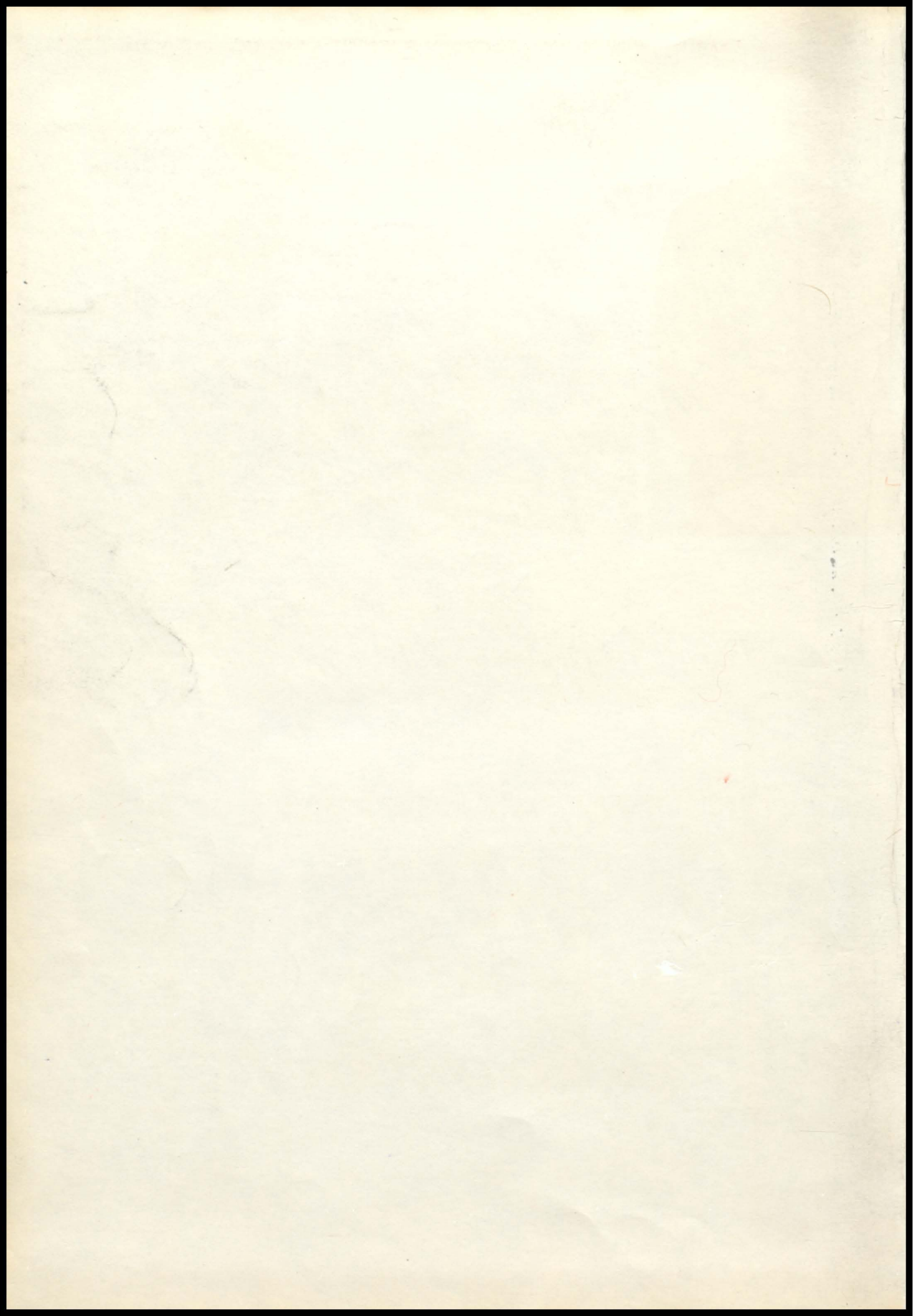

In September of 1961 twenty-six green freshmen entered Climax High School. We started the year with the traditional "Freshmen Initiation."

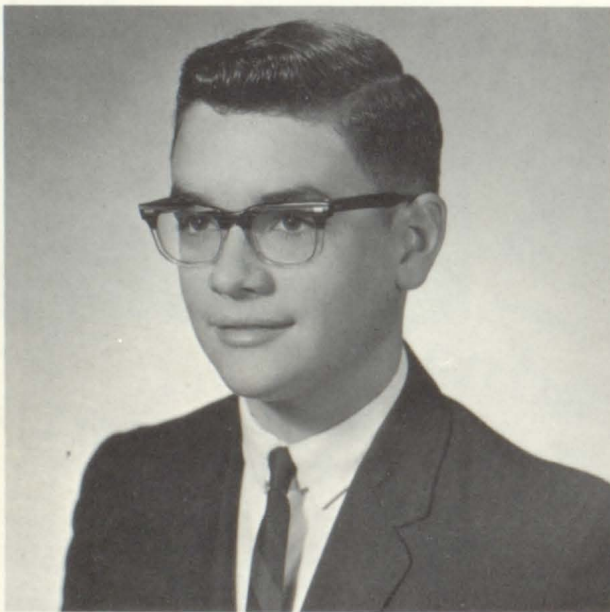
Our sophomore year was highlighted by the addition of fifteen new students from Central Valley. Several of us had the honor of serving for the Junior-Senior Banquet.
