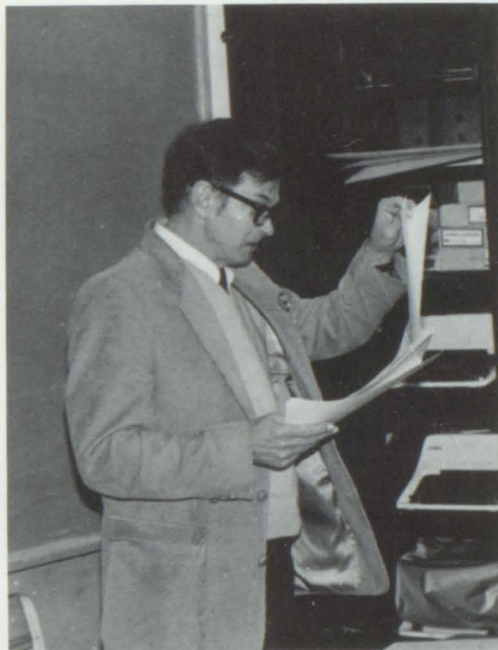

A Splash Of Football

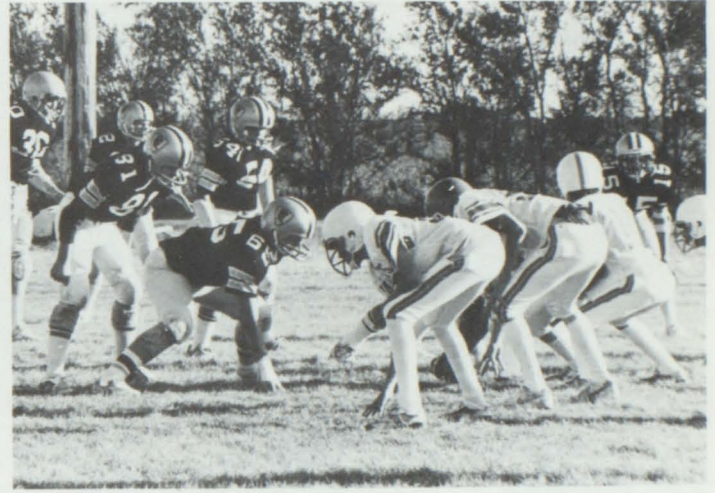

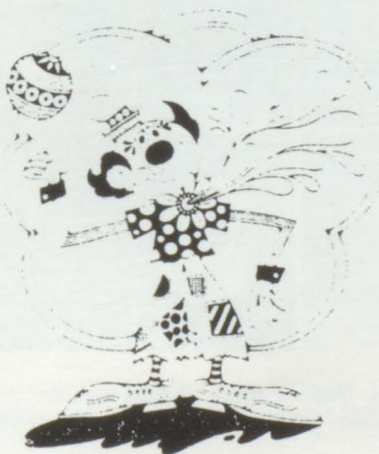
The fourth, fifth, and sixth grade students sang "Friends Forever" and "Go With a Song in Your Heart."

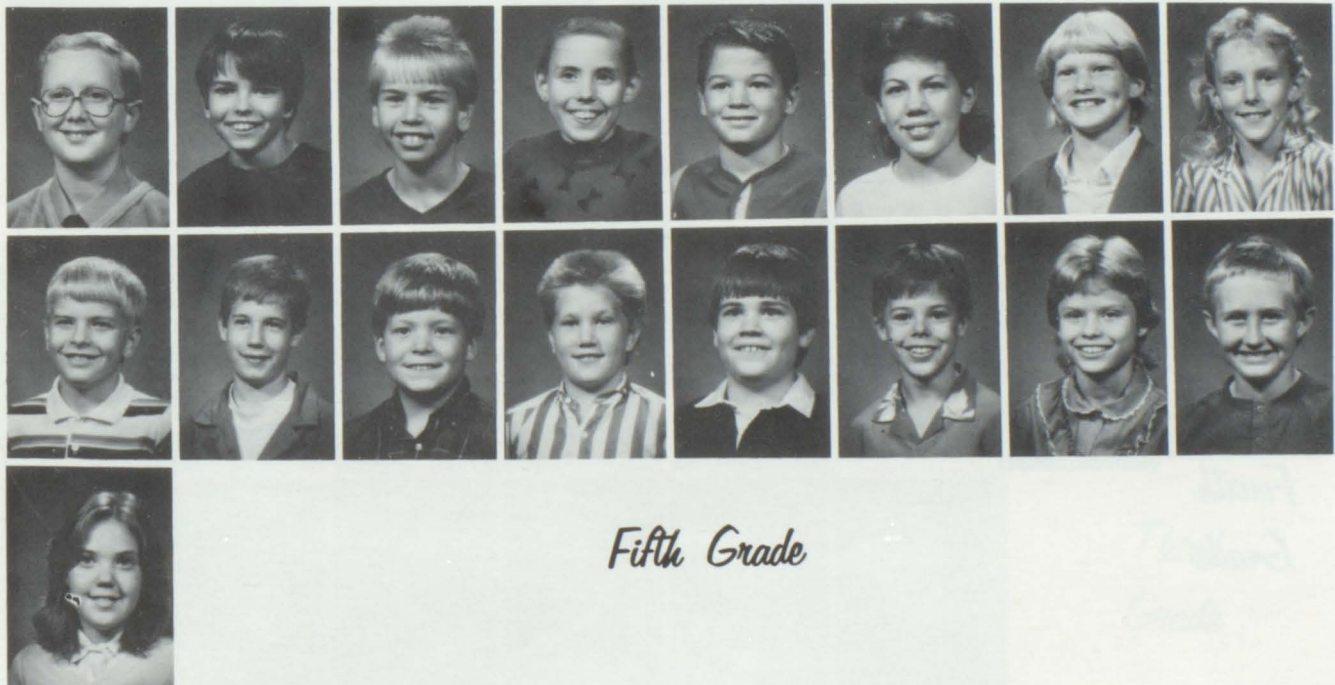

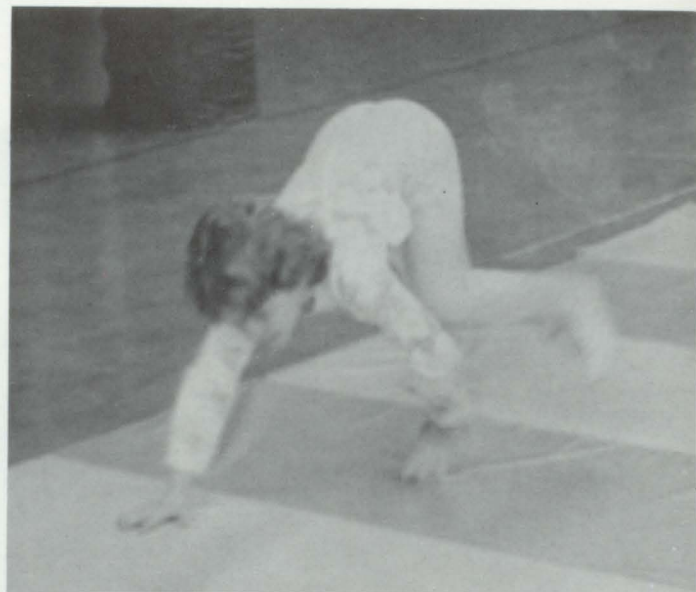

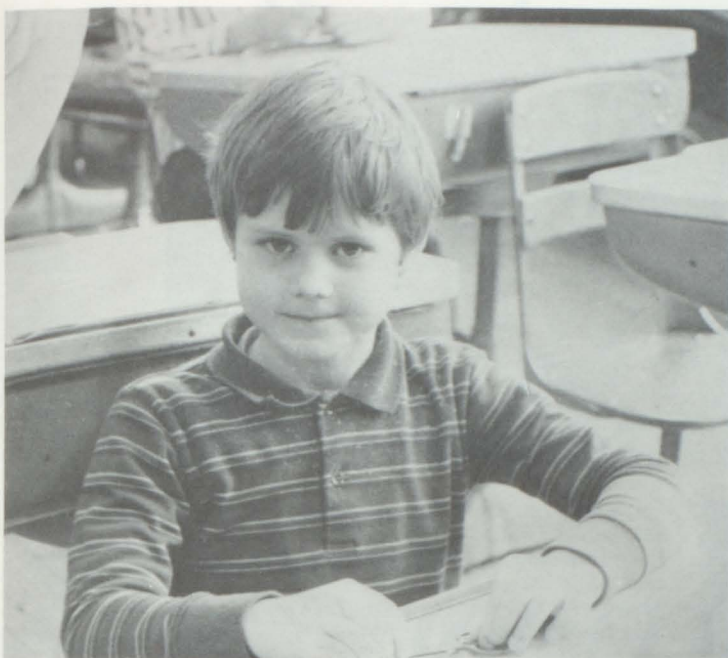

Then, to top the week off, the faculty had a dunking booth and a face painting booth at the carnival.

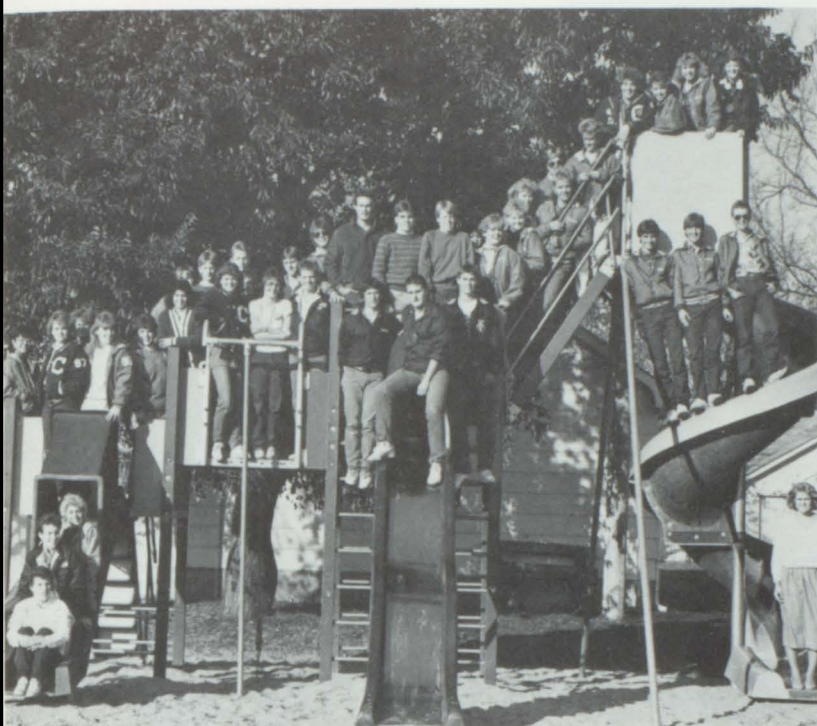

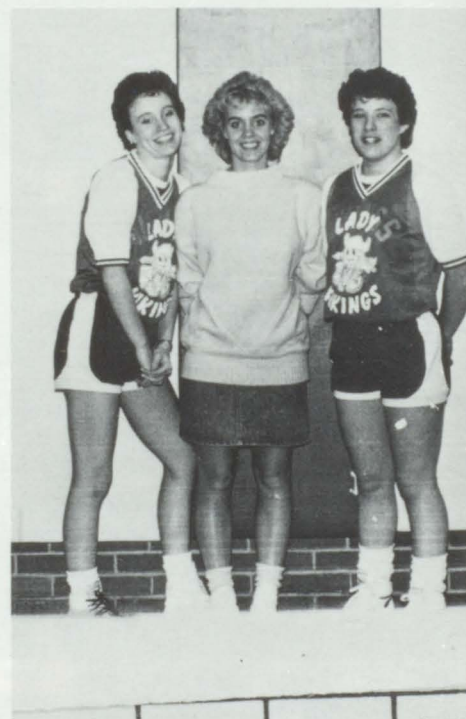

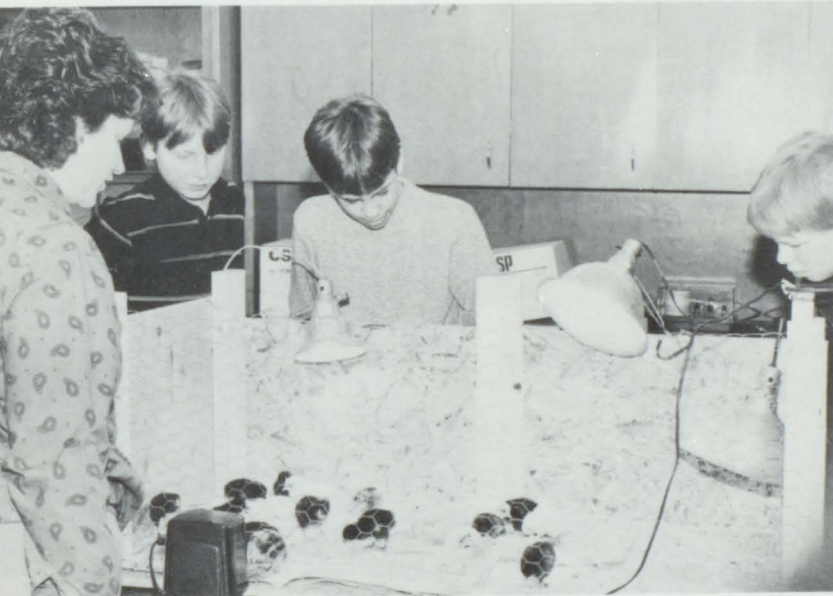

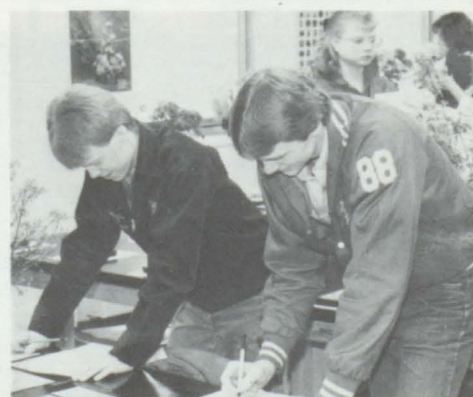

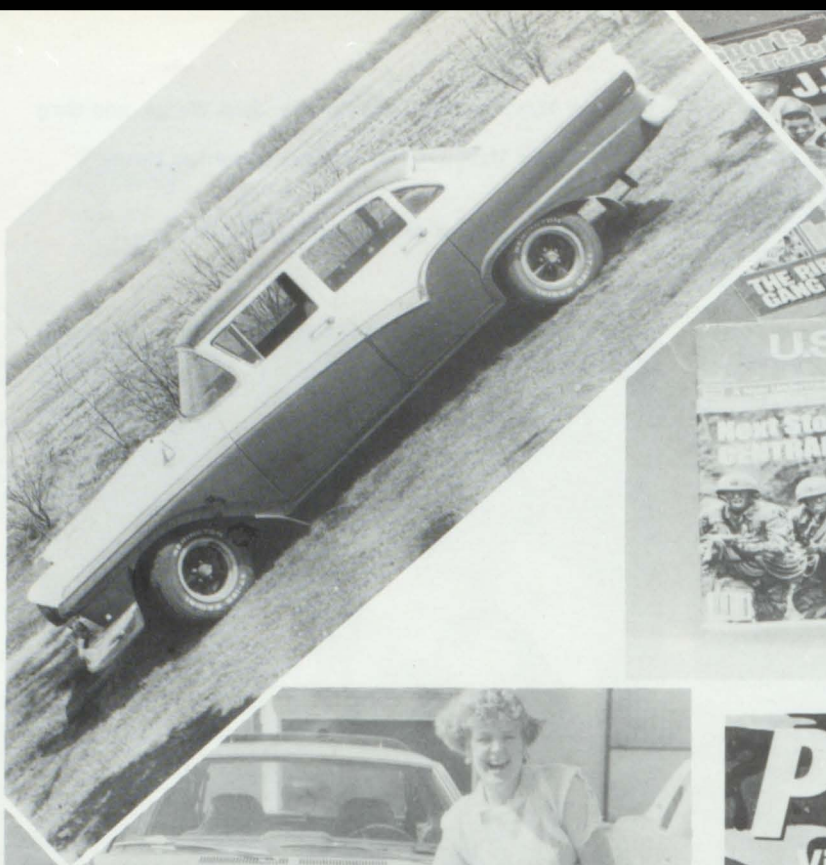

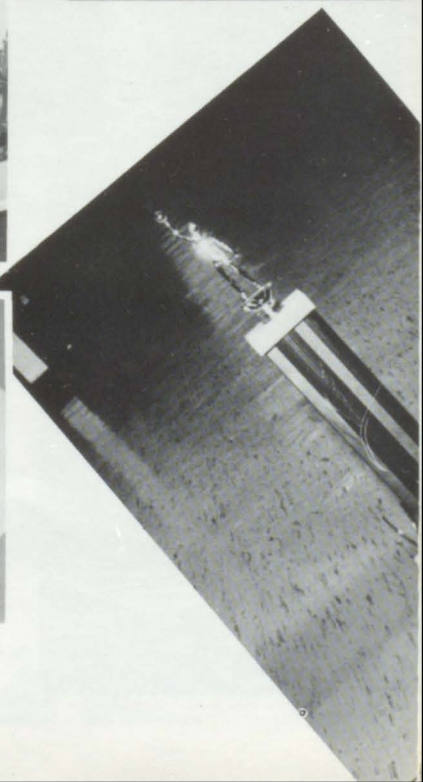

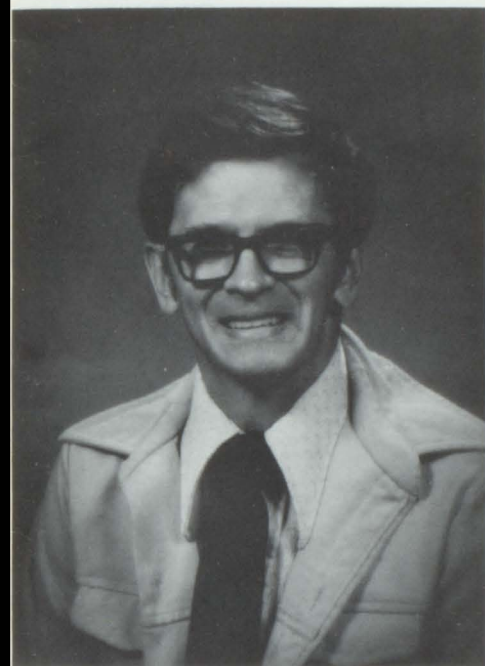

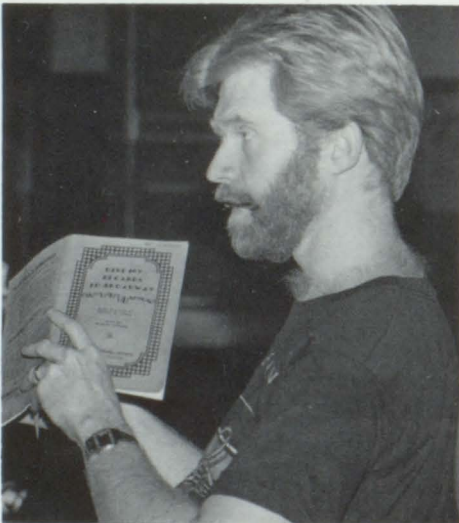

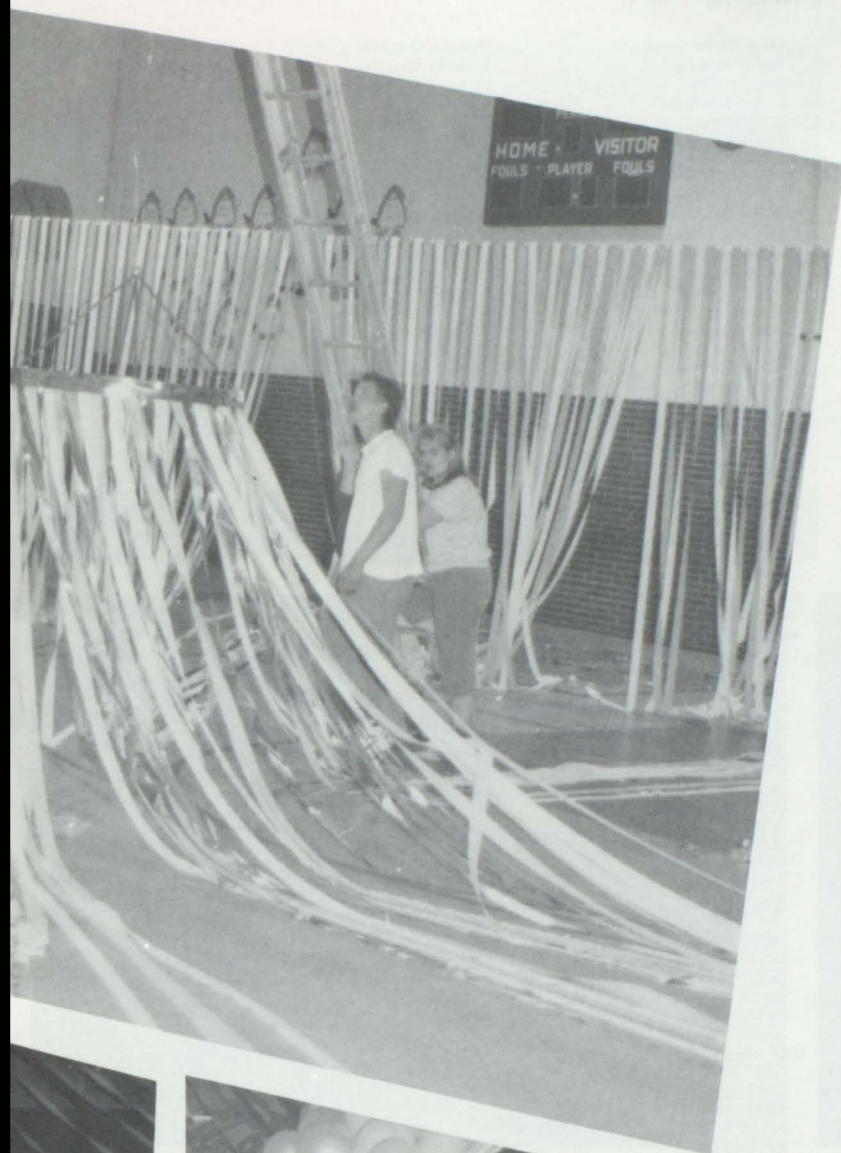

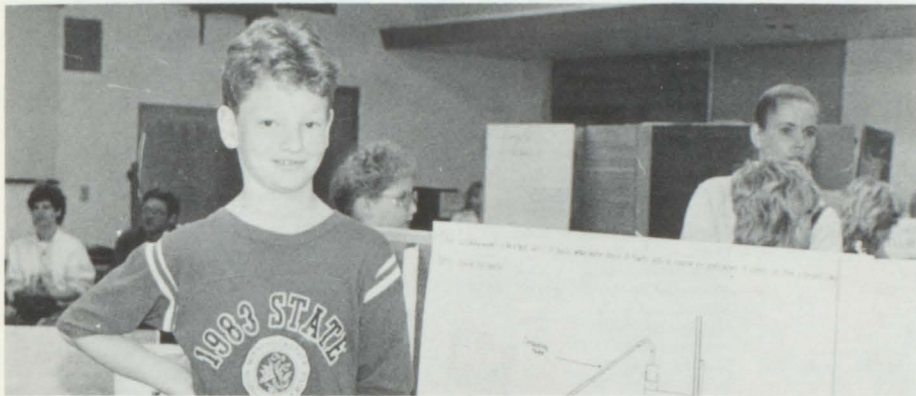
