



In Review NATIONAL EVENTS

1. On March 9, President Johnson presents the Medal of Honor to Spec. 6 Lawrence Joel, the first medic to win the nation's highest award for military gallantry.


4. On September 9, Debra Dene Barnes, Miss America 1968, was chosen Miss Kansas in a row to win this high honor.

Their record during the regular season was 9-4. Unfortunately we hit rough weather during tournament time, and lost to a determined Red Lake Falls team.



Heavy monsoon rains turned most of South Vietnam into a quagmire during the summer of 1967. Here, U.S. marines prepare to board a Chinook helicopter.


