Mrs. Kunkel will undoubtedly be happy when the school year comes to a close when she may relax from her duty as principal. Keeping all the high school students in order is no small task.




The Vocational Ag group under the leadership of Mr. Sandager has proved to be an active club. They sold pop at all the basketball games, and before the Christmas holidays they sold cards to the people in the surrounding communities. On April 15 the boys sponsored a successful father-and-son banquet. This summer the boys plan to take a vacation at one of the nearby lakes, accompanied by Mr. Sandager. The officers include Gerald Bruun, president; Delano Ostgaard, vice president; Virgil Swenson, secretary; Stanley Paulsrud, treasurer; Harley Bruun, reporter; Lowell Aker, sentinel, and Lee Sandager, advisor.

Among the extra class activities was the publication of a monthly farmers newspaper, *The Agricultural News*. It was distributed in the four communities of Climax, Nielsville, Shelly, and Eldred without cost. It contained valuable information about market trends, approved farm practices, and general agricultural news. As a class project the members of the Ag Department

acquired the task of exterminating rats and mice from the local dump grounds, elevators, and warehouses.

Under the direction of Mr. Sandager, the members also wrote radio programs which they gave over station KROX in Crookston. In October a delegation went to Kansas City for the national F. F. A. convention. On this trip they saw model farms, visited manufacturing plants, and were honored by seeing President Truman's home in Independence.

F. F. A. judging teams competed in the annual Red River Valley Winter Shows. The members all wrote essays on "Flax," the best of which were entered in the Flax Essay Contest. High honors went to Donald Rogenes who received honorable mention in the state contest. He won the state contest last year. Other winners were Norris Anderson, Donovan Monson, and Dale Brokke. For scholarship and leadership Leslie Langhus received the DeKalb Award.
