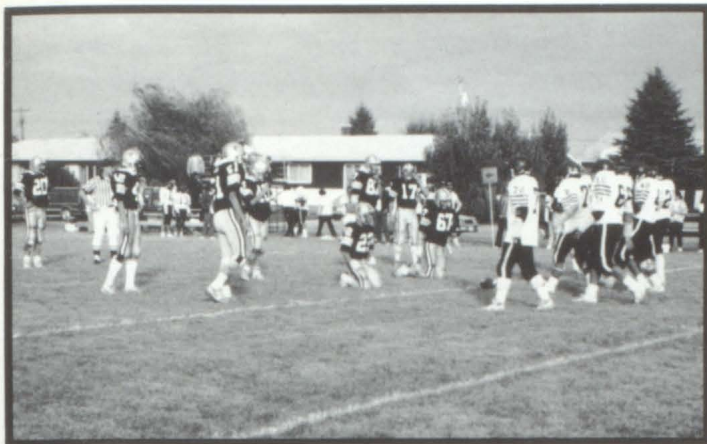

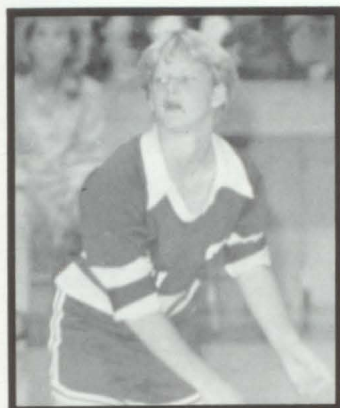

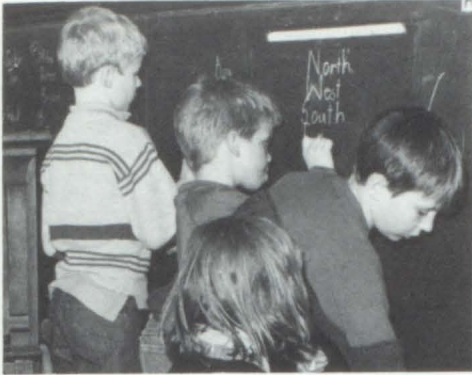

FOREIGN FUN with Marc Lewon



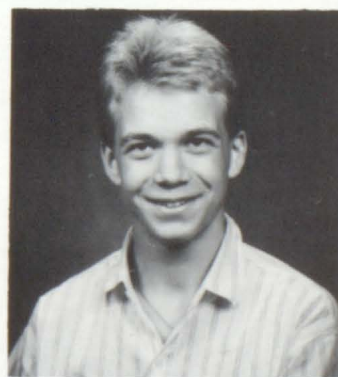
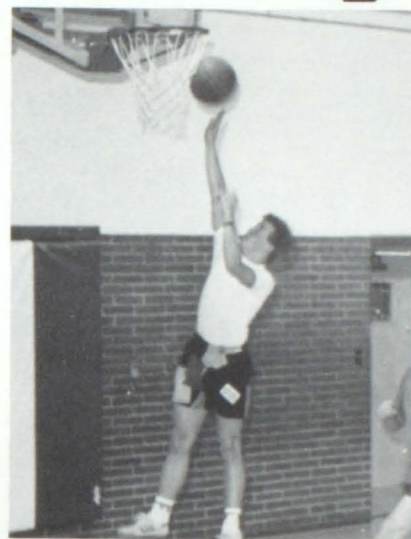

Marc thinks Germany is different to the U.S. in many ways. It starts with size of the country. West Germany is about half the size of the U.S., while its population is around 60 million.



All in all the '89-'90 season was a step in the right direction and with a little off-season work, the future should shine bright for CHS.

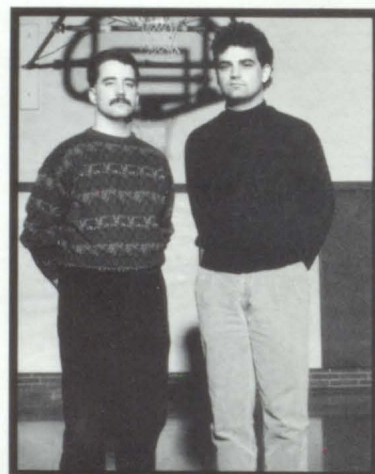

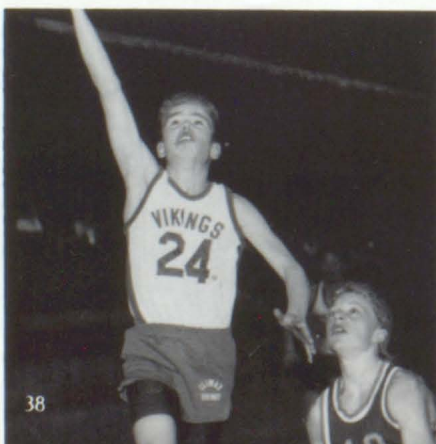

We would like you to meet the real man behind the Climax High School music stands, Mr. Myron Danielson.

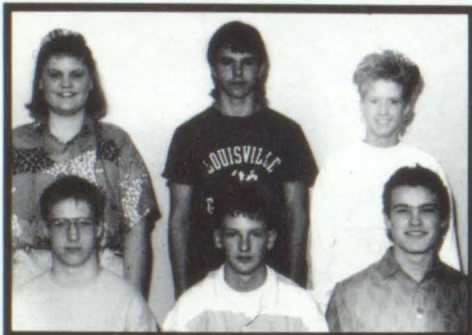

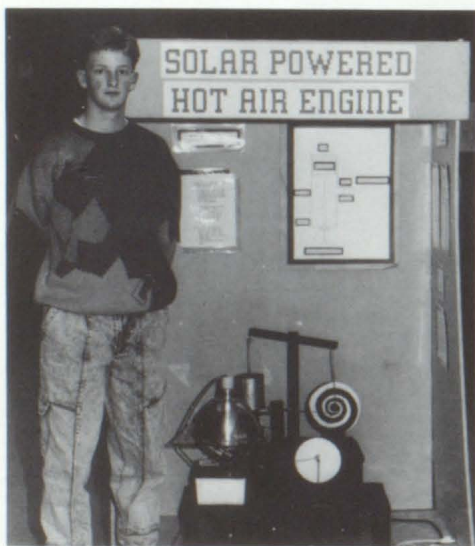

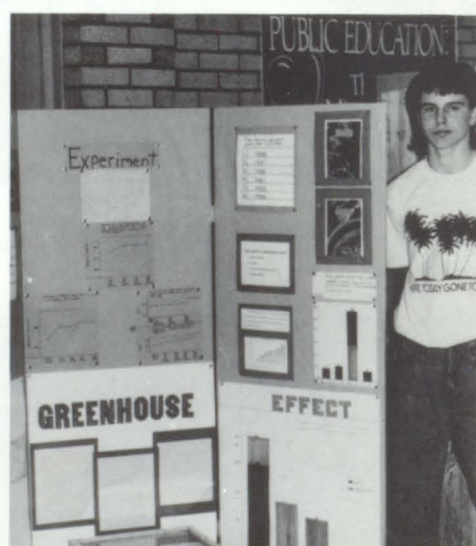

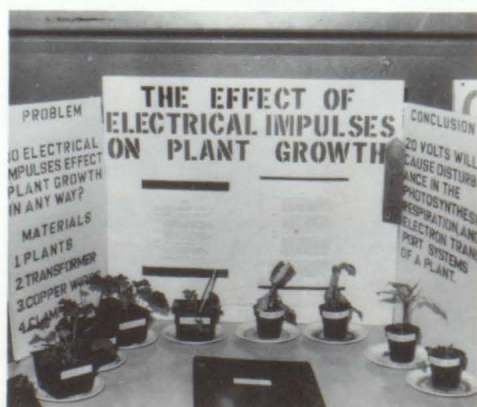

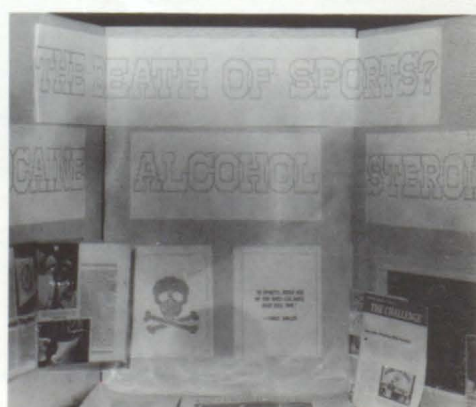

Daniel Dufner usually called, "Duff," describes himself as "Loud, rowdy, easy to get along with, and I like giving people a

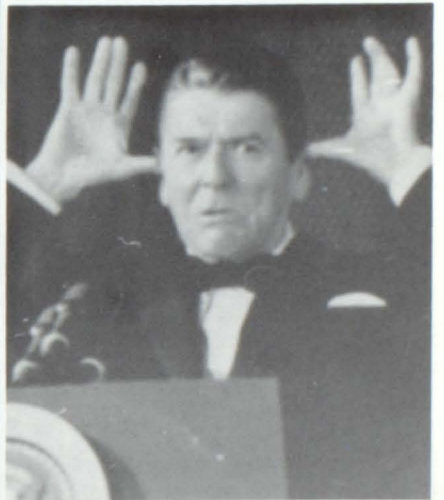
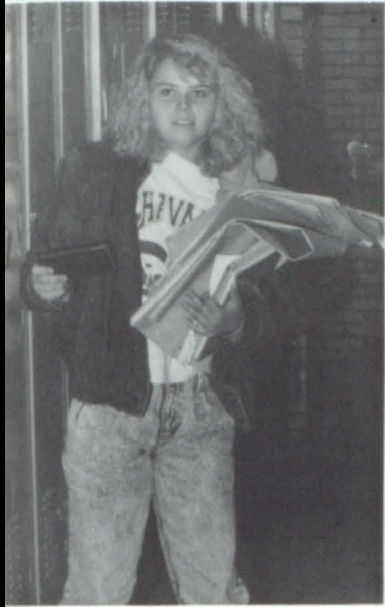
