The Year of 1974

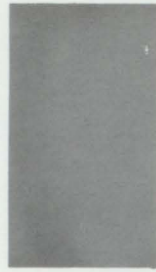

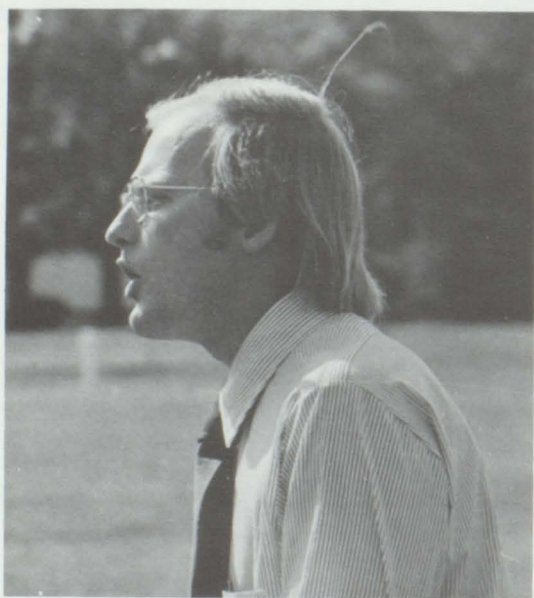
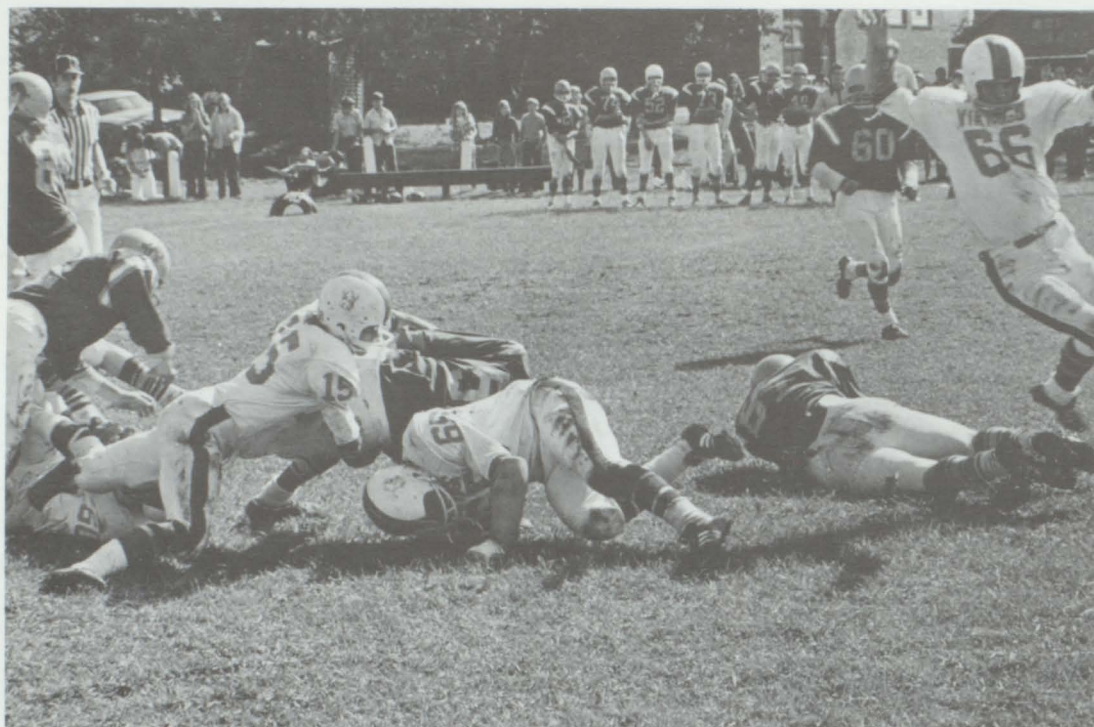


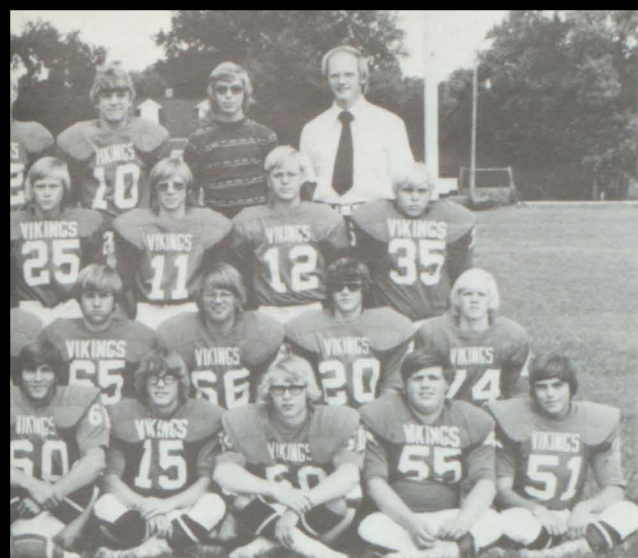
Football

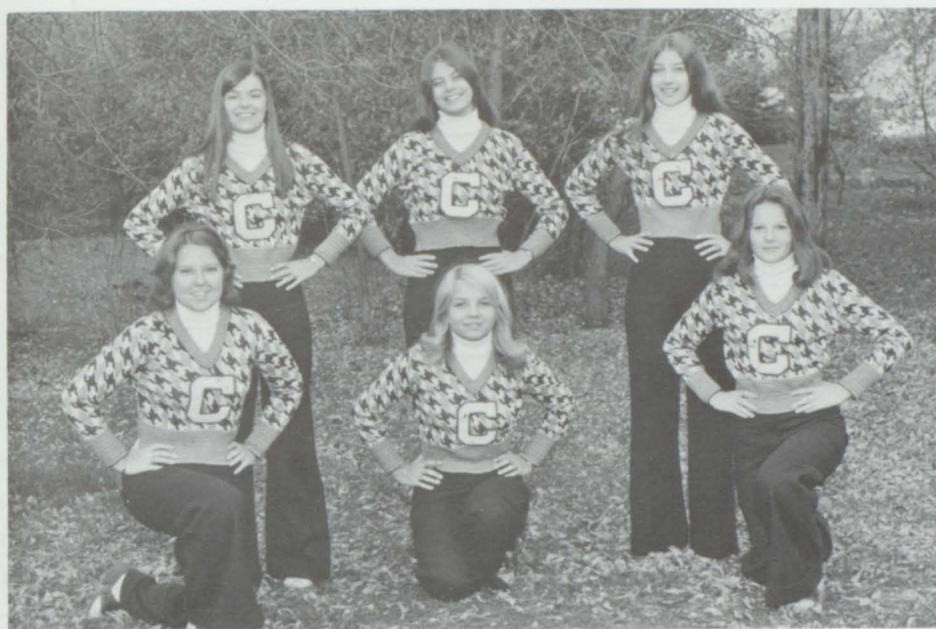
The evening was topped off by the crowning of this year's Homecoming Queen, Laurel Evenson.

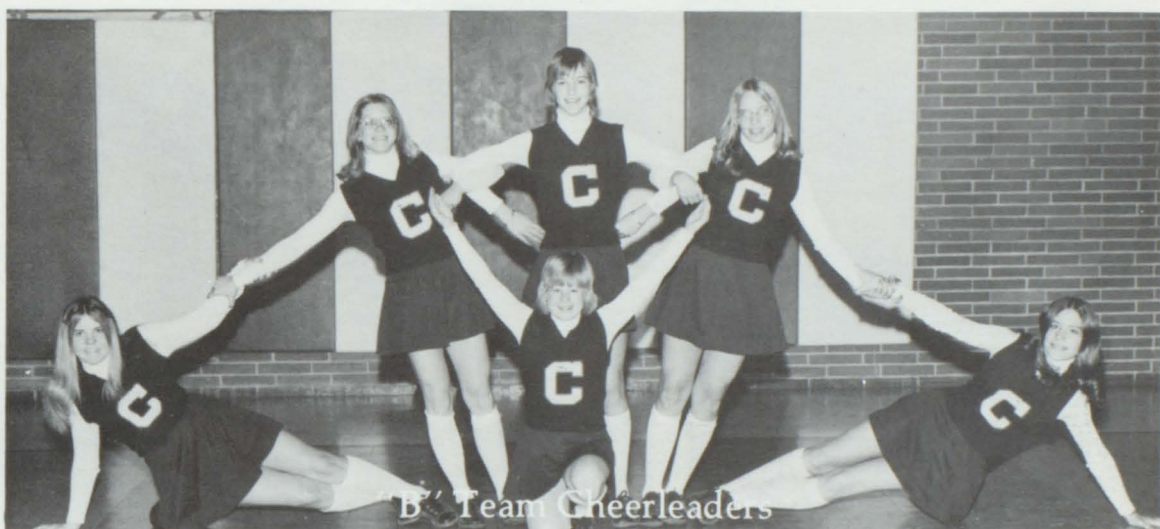
Even with this years record the A & B Squad Cheerleaders did a fine job in leading the specators. The girls' spirit and smiles brightened our tough season.

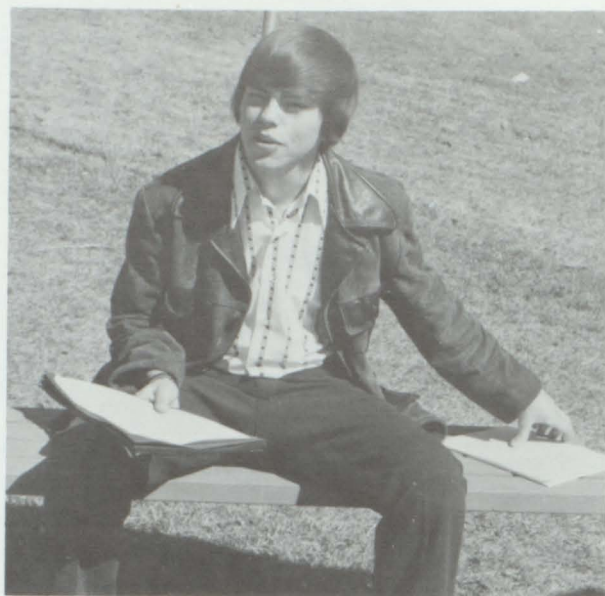


Organizations

I think that science was the most exciting thing of the whole year because I like science.

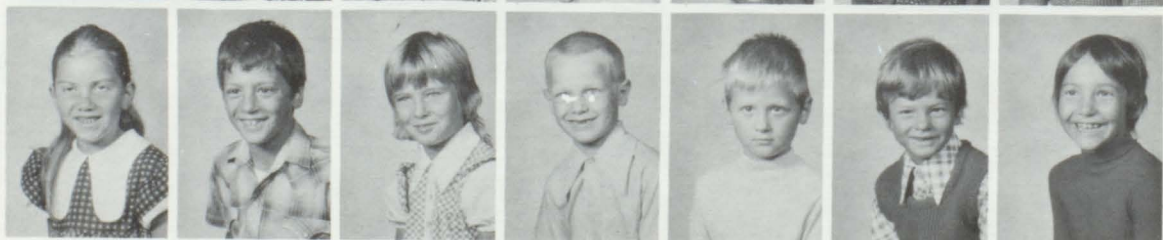

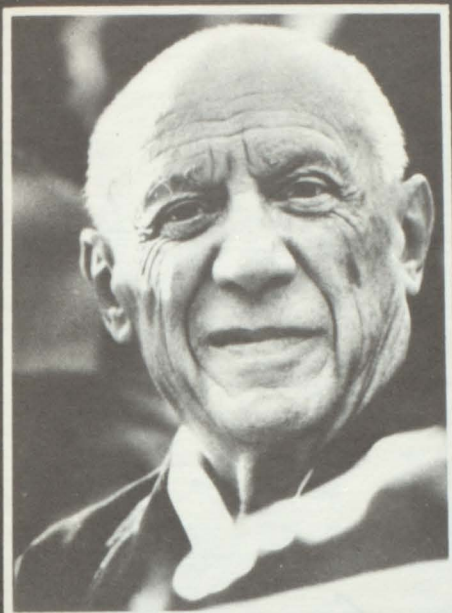
