The attendence was the largest of any previous Mother-Daughter Banquet held in Climax.


The Climax Ladies Aid sponsored the 1942 Father-Son Banquet which was given at the Climax Lutheran Church on Fiday, May 14, 1942.

There were 89 fathers and sons there and every one was very well satisfied with the event.



Our class, having decreased somewhat, is next to the largest class in high school, consisting of thirty seven students.




The class has been helping our Uncle Sam, also by buying Defense Bonds and Stamps. The girls have been doing their best by making food and sending it to the soldiers in camp.




In the District meet we lost 27-22 to a very good East Grand Fords team that went on to win the tournament.

Boys seeing the most action this year were: Duaine Howland, Robert Nelson, Gustave Oien, Warren Sanderson and Vernon Rudd.


