


More than a thousand years ago, the Vikings, who were called "the Northmen", sailed from their homes in Norway, Sweden, and Denmark. The Vikings had fast wooden ships, and they were good sailors. The Vikings were also brave and clever. Although they had no compasses, they sailed their ships as far west as America. and eastward down the The rivers of Russia. history of several countries was changed by these adventurers from the far north.

Many of the Vikings who lived along the Scandinavian sea coasts knew how to build boats and sail them. Nobody else built ships like the Vikings. None of their neighbors had ships with sails, so none could travel as quickly. Because of the shallow shape of their ships, the Vikings could sail them up shallow But the rivers. ships were big enough to take men and horses, and all the things they needed to camp on shore.




The Vikings built several different kinds of ships. They had sturdy boats for carrying goods from one coastal town to another. They also had great warships. These were called "longships" because of their long, narrow shape. They could be rowed, but also carried sails. When the wind filled these sails, the long, narrow ships seemed to fly through the water. The front of a ship, called the prow, Was sometimes carved with the head of a dragon. it made the ship look like a fierce sea monster.


Once they had discovered what other lands were like, some of the Vikings began to think of leaving their own homes forever, and settling somewhere better.

The Vikings sailed westward from their homelands far across the sea. First they found the island of Iceland. Many Vikings made their homes there. One of them was called Eric the Red - because of his red hair. He sailed farther west from Iceland and discovered Greenland. Greenland is very cold with little good land for farming. Eric the Red's son, Leif Eriksson, decided to sail even farther west in search of better land. He and his men braved the cold seas nobody had dared to sail before. At last he reached the coast North America.




The money from the sales was used towards the Junior-Senior prom which was held on the Dakota Queen, the new paddle boat in Grand Forks.



#### Sixth Grade










The Climax Junior-Senior Prom was held Saturday, Mary 3rd, 1986, on the Dakota Queen River Boat in Grand Forks.




### Yearbook Communications
