






Cruising Through Football


Here are some of the places they chose:




Going from three days to five is quite a change when your seven years old. This is exactly what you go through when you hit first grade.



Mr. George Taus said he doesn't know and doesn't care. Mr. Taus teaches accounting, typing, drivers education, health, and phy. ed.







The 1988-89 girls basketball team had the most successful season since Climax has started the girl's basketball program.





MEMORIES by John Wegge






